HONORING THE LEGACY OF THE LATE, GREAT ALEX TREBEK.

Ring ring. I picked up my office phone and heard, "Hi, this is Alex Trebek. I hear you're building a homeless shelter and I'd like to come see it."

I made an appointment, and the next morning, a truck pulled up. Out walks THE Alex Trebek, wearing blue jeans and a baseball cap. I showed him around and he said he would be in touch.

A few weeks later, he called to request our audited financials. I sent them over and he asked me to come

to his house the next morning. On his desk were our financials – highlighted, circled and notated. He said he liked our social enterprises and the way we were running the Mission. He then slid an envelope across his desk... with a check for \$100,000!

I asked if I could give him a hug and get a picture. He gave me a hug but asked me to wait for a better picture. He then arranged for my wife and I to visit Jeopardy and put us in the (continued on page 3)

front row. He stopped in the middle of taping and brought us up on stage, where he talked about the crisis of homelessness in L.A. and the work of the Mission, and then took the picture you see here.

Just before we opened our North Hollywood shelter in June 2020, Alex called me up again and asked if he could bring his wife, Jean, to come see the multipurpose room we named after them. I took them on a tour, and while we were chatting, Jean reached into her pocket and handed me a check for \$500,000!

I was stunned, but they told me they love what we are doing and wanted to invest in our Mission. I asked them if I could use this as the lead gift for the next shelter we were planning to build, and they said they would be honored.




Sponsor a Bed
